SUB BRANCH HONORARY SECRETARY REPORT

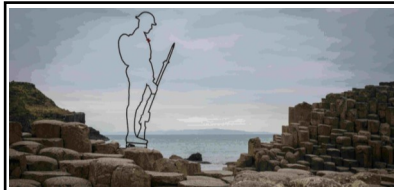
